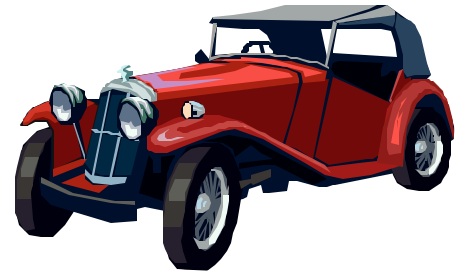

were to investigate the need for affordable housing, availability of students graduating from K-12, internships provided by higher education, Maryville Treatment Center offenders returning to the workforce and availability of technical training from regional technical high schools.

In April of 2004, following the plant manager's February request, and after over 3000 man-hours of investigations by the five taskforces it was determined there were adequate resources and opportunities to positively impact the need to recruit new employees and meet the operational goals of the Nodaway based industries. The April gathering became the starting point of celebration. To affect population growth and to attract employees to Nodaway County when surrounding areas are losing population and the labor marketing is tightening is a daunting task. Over 100 dedicated volunteers have diligently met on a consistent basis to develop plans and implement programs based on the challenge statements identified in 2004. Now after more than two years we are at a point of celebrating our accomplishments and reflection on the challenges still before us.

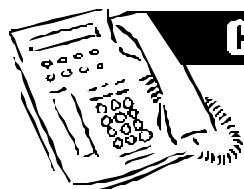
