Northwest is committed to preventing violence through Green Dot, a violence prevention initiative focused on reducing violence such as stalking, sexual assault and partner violence.



A green dot is any behavior, choice, word or attitude that interrupts violence or sends a message that violence is not okay. As a part of the Northwest community, people can help set the norm that violence is unacceptable and everyone is expected to do their part to keep the community safe. Identifying concerning behaviors that might indicate violence, unique ways to interrupt violence by drawing on strengths and personality, and how the Green Dot approach could be beneficial and useful to developing as a professional, will be explored through this program.
